Subject: Show cause notice for withdrawal of Essentiality Certificate/ No Objection Certificate.

With reference to the above captioned subject, the Department of Medical Education & Research, Government of Punjab, hereby issues you notice to show cause as to why the Essentiality Certificates/ No Objection certificates vide Nos. 2/75/05-4HB-III/ 5012 dated 3.11.2005 and 2/30/2008-4HB-III/ 3154 dated 19.5.2008, granted to the Gian Sagar Educational and Charitable Trust[**the Trust**] for setting up and running the Gian Sagar College of Physiotherapy, Ramnagar,(Banur) Distt. Patiala [**the College**] Physiotherapy Course with intake of 50 seats per year for B.P.T. courses and Physiotherapy Course with intake of 15 seats per year for M.P.T. courses may not be withdrawn on the following grounds:

1. WHEREAS the State Government had issued the Essentiality Certificates/ No Objection Certificates in your favour for setting up of the College.
2. Whereas the State Government had reserved its right vide clause 2(vii) of Essentiality Certificate dated 19.5.2008 to withdraw the Essentiality Certificate/ No Objection Certificate in case of non-compliance with the conditions of grant of such Certificate(s). The State Government is duty bound to take over the responsibility of the students already admitted in your College with the permission of Government of India/ the concerned regulatory Council.
3. Whereas the Essentiality Certificate dated 3.11.2005 was issued on the condition that will acquire complete infrastructure, facility and faculty before making admissions. Furthermore as per clause 2(iii) the pay scales and emoluments of the staff shall be as per Punjab Government



pay scales. Furthermore as per clause 2 (vi) the project to be implemented as per the approved project report.

4. Whereas the Trust had earlier also given an undertaking in April 2016 to create a corpus /fund for smooth functioning of the College but the same was not done. Further the commitment by the management to the State as well as to the University regarding intimating them on regular basis, in respect of utilization of funds was also not honoured.
5. Whereas various complaints have been received during the period February-March 2017 from the parents of the students, faculty and other supporting staff in respect of the management of the College.
6. Whereas an inspection was therefore got conducted by a duly constituted Inspection Committee through the Department of Medical Education and Research and Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot. Inspection Committee by its report dated 4th March 2017 has found glaring deficiencies. **A copy of Inspection Report with its annexures is appended herewith.**
7. Whereas a careful perusal of the Inspection Report submitted by the Inspection Committee reveals that no salary has been paid to the employees after October, 2016 and there is complete mismanagement of finances generated from students fees and hospital income and the staff including the teaching staff has refused to resume duties till the clearance of pending salary. Furthermore, there has been no teaching for the last one month. There has been only few clinical classes for the last 6 months due to paucity of patients/ clinical material in the hospital resulting into crippling and suspension of teaching and practicals of Under Graduate and Post Graduate students. There is not only deficiency of faculty but even the existing faculty is not working due to non disbursement of salary. The College has been unable to maintain the required standards and infrastructure in respect of faculty, clinical material and other facilities such as hostel, mess including electricity, water supply, etc. and further the management is also not in a sound financial state to run the affairs of the College given its liabilities running into crores of rupees.
8. Whereas the State Government had made various efforts to find a solution/ remedy, including calling for meetings with the management seeking concrete action plan for revival of Trust/College to which the management did not respond positively. Written notices were received by the trustees as well as the Chief Executive Officer but no 'way-forward' was put forth for resumption of the teaching activity in the College.

11. Whereas no action has been taken in spite of the written assurances and undertakings till date and the teaching activities in the College are lying stalled resulting in serious implications on the career of hundreds of students duly admitted in the College.

In view of the above, you are asked to Show-Cause as to why immediate action regarding withdrawal of Essentiality Certificate/ No Objection Certificates of the College, not be taken .

In case no satisfactory response is received within 7 days of the issuance of this notice, the Department of Medical Education and Research, Government of Punjab shall take immediate further action for withdrawal of the said Essentiality Certificate/ No Objection Certificates.



With reference to the above captioned subject, the Department of Medical Education & Research, Government of Punjab, hereby issues you notice to show cause as to why the Essentiality Certificates/ No Objection certificates vide Nos. 2/60/06/6HBIII/ 3344 dated 20.06.2006 and 2/22/2013-4HB-III/ 2727 dated 28.05.2013 granted to the Gian Sagar Educational and Charitable Trust **[the Trust]** for setting up and running the Gian Sagar Dental College and Hospital, Ramnagar, (Banur) Distt. Patiala **[the College]** B.D.S. Course with intake of 100 seats per year and M.D.S Courses with intake of 54 seats per year may not be withdrawn on the following grounds:


1. Whereas the State Government had issued the above mentioned Essentiality Certificates/ No Objection Certificates in your favour for setting up of the College.
2. Whereas the State Government had reserved its right vide clause 3 (k) of Essentiality Certificate of 20.6.2006, to withdraw the Essentiality Certificate/ No Objection Certificate in case of non-compliance with the conditions of grant of such Certificate(s). The State Government is duty bound to take over the responsibility of the students already admitted in your College with the permission of Government of India/ the concerned regulatory Council.
3. Whereas the Essentiality Certificate dated 20.6.2006 was issued on the certification mentioned in clause 2 (iii) that the trust is owning and managing a Dental Hospital and further as per clause 2 (v) that



Minimum 30 OPD Dental patients per day are available to begin with. It is further added that in case the applicant fails to create infrastructure for the Dental College as per Dental Council of India norms and fresh admissions are stopped by Dental Council of India, the State Government shall take over the responsibility of the students already admitted in the college. Furthermore as per clause 3 (g) of the Essentiality Certificate dated 20.6.2006, pay scale and emoluments of the staff were required to be given as per stipulated norms. Furthermore, as per clause 3 (h), the Inspection of Institute shall be carried out on yearly basis upto the completion of the study of first batch of the students. Thereafter, the inspection shall be periodical after three years.

4. Whereas the Trust had earlier also given an undertaking in April 2016 to create a corpus /fund for smooth functioning of the College but the same was not done. Further the commitment by the management to the State as well as to the University regarding intimating them on regular basis, in respect of utilization of funds was also not honoured.
5. Whereas various complaints have been received during the period February-March 2017 from the parents of the students, faculty and other supporting staff in respect of the management of the College.
6. Whereas an inspection was therefore got conducted by a duly constituted Inspection Committee through the Department of Medical Education and Research and Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot. Inspection Committee by its report dated 4th March 2017 has found glaring deficiencies. **A copy of Inspection Report with its annexures is appended herewith.**
7. Whereas a careful perusal of the Inspection Report submitted by the Inspection Committee reveals that no salary has been paid to the employees since October, 2016 despite repeated assurances by the Management from time to time. There is complete mismanagement of finances generated from students fees and hospital income and the staff including the teaching staff has suspended their duties from 1.2.2017 till the clearance of pending salary. Furthermore, there has been no teaching for the last one month. There has been only few clinical classes for the last 6 months due to paucity of patients/ clinical material in the hospital resulting into crippling and suspension of teaching and practicals of Under Graduate and Post Graduate students. There is not only deficiency of faculty but even the existing faculty is not working due to non disbursement of salary. The College has been unable to maintain the required standards and infrastructure in respect of faculty, clinical material and other facilities such as hostel, mess including electricity, water supply, etc. and further the management is also not in a sound financial state to run the affairs of the College given its liabilities running into crores of rupees.
8. Whereas the State Government had made various efforts to find a solution/ remedy, including calling for meetings with the management seeking concrete action plan for revival of Trust/College to which the management did not respond positively. Written notices were received by the trustees as well as the Chief Executive Officer but no 'way-forward' was put forth for resumption of the teaching activity in the College.



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Inspection report - Gian Sagar Medical College & Hospital, Banur.

The following faculty members inspected the institute on 1st March 2017

- IV. Dr. Harmander Singh, Prof & Head Pharmacology, GGS Medical College Faridkot.

The following observations were made by the committee members:

Faculty:

Committee members took the total list of faculty presently working in the College from the Principal office and thereafter, physical verification of the faculty with their signatures was done. The observed strength (Head count) at 11.30AM on 1/3/2017 was as follows:

I. Professor	17
II. Associate Professor	13
III. Assistant Professor	15
IV. Senior resident	03
V. Junior resident/demonstrator	18

The faculty members are neither taking classes nor regularly examining patients but just come in the college council room

On interaction with the faculty members in the college council room, the following grievances were reported:

1. No salary paid after October 2016
2. No accountability of funds i.e. mismanagement of the finances generated from student fee and hospital income. The faculty members were unanimously of the opinion that the income from student fee is sufficient enough to meet with the salary of whole staff including the paramedical & class IV employees but there is some kind of siphoning of the same leading to a financial crisis
3. Excess of ministerial and clerical staff, disproportionate to the requirement, also precipitating the financial crisis
4. On 15th April 2016, the management committed (undertaking by the CEO) to create a separate corpus fund (from student fee) solely for the disbursement of salary, in the presence of Vice Chancellor BPHHS, Secretary Medical Education and DRME, but no action taken till date
5. Resumption of duties not only after clearance of pending salaries but also on creation of separate corpus fund so that such a situation does not build up in the future.
6. The hospital has unlimited scope of patient inflow and this clubbed with the availability of all the infrastructure & building, the hospital has tremendous capability of providing ultimate patient care and clinical material for UG & PG teaching

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The College has post graduate program in two disciplines i.e. Surgery & Anaesthesiology with an intake of 2 students per session and presently there are a total of 8 PG students in the 2 disciplines. The interaction with these students highlighted the following points:

1. No stipend paid for the last 7 months
2. Total lack of teaching & clinical work because of poor patient inflow for the last 6 months and practically none for the last 1 month. Approximately 150 surgeries carried out in the last 18 months.
3. Thesis work badly affected due to lack of clinical/teaching work in respective subjects and this is giving them restless nights.
4. No recent journal/book purchased in the last 2 years.
5. Erratic power supply in the hostel.

The students repeatedly requested that they be shifted to other institutes keeping in view that their career was at stake and that even if the institute gets back to work now, its going to take many months to normalise.

UG students:

Interaction with UG students of all the sessions revealed that,

1. no under graduate teaching for the last one month.
2. all the students forced to pay their respective fee in advance (Rs 7 lac each from 50 students under management quota & Rs 4 lac each from 50 students under Govt quota) but still deprived of their basic right to education.
3. erratic power supply with long power cuts in the hostel in addition to unhygienic washrooms.
4. erratic availability of meals in the hostel mess inspite of the fact that mess payments already made in advance to the college authorities.
5. made to pay undue fine (Rs 500 for each class) for shortage of attendance even if the same is much more than the MCI norms.
6. only few clinical classes for the last 6 months due to paucity of patients/clinical material in the hospital

Hospital functioning:

Electricity/ power supply of the hospital disconnected due to lack of payment of pending bills and presently the hospital receiving the same from genset.

OPD:

Total OPD attendance of 35 patients at 2 PM with almost all the OPD's giving a deserted look. Not only that, the OPD attendance quite low for the last 6 months. OPD patients being attended by the residents and occasionally by the faculty members sometime in their offices only.

IPD:

No patient admitted in the entire hospital, both Medicine & allied and Surgery & allied specialities. All the wards giving a deserted look with some of them locked.

No emergency registration in the last 24 hrs and prior to this, only 5-6 entries per day and that too OPD cases only. Even prior to one month, very thin emergency patient attendance in the Emergency record.

Diagnostics:

No patient registration in Radio-Diagnosis deptt at 2.15pm and same about all the laboratories because of unavailability of reagents, kits, etc

Financial Assessment :

- AGM finance admitted to the committee members that no salary paid to any staff member including faculty, paramedics and class 3/4 employees for the last 4-6 months.
- College defaulted in payment of loan to PNB as the instalment of Rs 4.5 crore due in Jan 2017 not deposited.
- Total annual income is approx Rs47 crore (Rs 40crore from student fee and Rs 7 crore from hospital), which is more than that required to cover the salary of all categories of staff
- The net present liability is approx Rs52 crore in addition to Rs11 crore bank loan

Summary/ Conclusions :

Gyan Sagar Medical College & Hospital, with an annual intake of 100 UG & 4 PG (in 2 disciplines) students is presently crippled with suspended UG/PG teaching and practically nil OPD/IPD strength for 1 month primarily and solely because of lack of funds. There is not only deficiency of faculty but even the existing faculty is not working due to non disbursement of salaries for 4 months. The salary of paramedical & class 3/4 staff also stands pending for the last 5-6 months. PG teaching needs urgent intervention for smooth thesis work & good clinical exposure. UG classes and hospital functioning, which is totally paralysed, needs to be restored and the accommodation/mess facilities need to be monitored regularly. Most important, the funds generated & spent by the management requires monitoring so that the same is spent judiciously on salary & hospital /patient care thereby creating accountability for the same, more so because the previous undertaking given by the management (to the Govt) has not been complied with.

Suggestions:

As already mentioned in the observations it is evidently clear that at present Gian Sagar Medical College management is not prepared to take interest in resolving the above mentioned problems and put the institution in the working mode; the committee members give the following suggestions.

1. The Government should give a notice to the management to clear the financial liabilities and put the college in the working mode. They should also assure smooth working of college in future.
2. Failing this the Government should make alternative arrangements to run the college. As this is the question of career of MBBS and PG students. This also concerns the faculty and paramedical staff, as the salaries are not being paid. In that case the faculty of the college which is already getting reduced may become very thin in number which would further hamper the career of MBBS as well as PG students.

Reference to above subject, we, the Faculty member of Gian Sagar Medical College, request you

In February 2016, because of non-payment of salaries for 6 months, Gian Sagar Faculty and staff went on strike which continued for nearly 3 months. Due to this the studies of MBBS, MD/MS, DDS, MSc, Physiotherapy and Nursing students were badly affected. After the intervention of worthy Vice-Chancellor, DRME and Secretary Medical Education the issue was resolved with following understanding.

There will be separate bank account (ESCROW account) of students' tuition fees and from this account salaries will be paid to all the employees required according to MCI norms.

All faculty members will regularly receive their salaries within first week of every month.

Upto above understanding, till September 2016, we were paid salaries very irregularly sometimes after one or three months. BUT FROM OCTOBER 2016, WE HAVE NOT RECEIVED SALARIES.

As such, my 'faculty salary' is the minimum than other (Govt. as well as private) medical colleges. As management is unable to pay staff salaries.

We are the management many times for release of our salaries, but due to their callous attitude towards students and faculty members, WE WERE FORCED TO SUSPEND OUR DUTIES FROM FEBRUARY 2017. Despite FIVE weeks of our suspension of duties, management didn't still come to negotiation table.

As MCI regulation from any time in May 2017 and in the present scenario of bare minimum faculty, which is not ready to leave because of non-payment of salaries, this der-recognition of the institution by MCI government is on the mind. This will badly affect the studies and future of approx. 2000 students of MBBS, MD/MS, DDS, MSc, Physiotherapy and Nursing.

So kindly, I request you to resolve a matter, as possible in the interest of students, faculty and the institution.

- No food for students in mess and canteen.

- Very less pay structure as per MCI norms.

OUR DEMANDS

1. Immediate payment of salaries till date.
2. To prevent any issue in future, pertaining to salary disbursement we would suggest
 - Government should intervene and in public interest, if possible take over the institution and run accordingly.
 - As the present management is unable to run the institution, so force this management to sell the institute to some other party who could smoothly run it, as per MCI norms.
 - Creation of a bank account meant specifically for deposition of tuition fees of MBBS students of GSMCH only. An official / representative from BFUHS, DME or Health Secretary should be given authority to operate the said account who in turn would be responsible for timely disbursement of monthly salaries to GSMCH faculty and staff hired strictly as per MCI norms.

Gian Sagar medical college in fiscal mess again

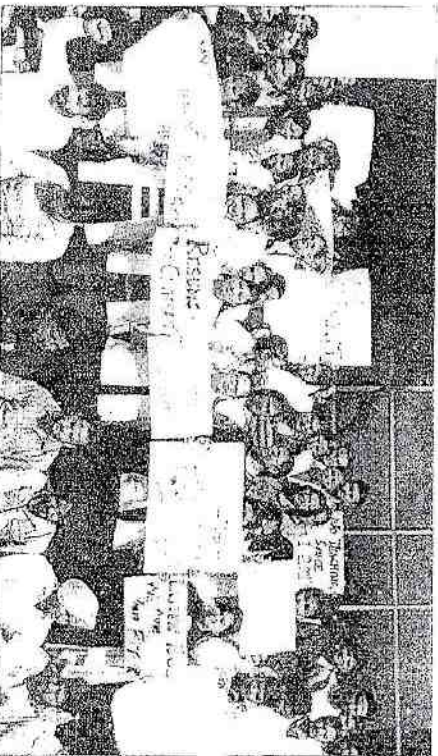

The issue of the non-payment of salaries to the medical and paramedical staff of Gian Sagar Medical College and Hospital, Bannu, for the past five months has brought down the institute on its knees yet again as the teaching and medical facilities in the institute have been suspended for the past one month, causing great loss to the students and patients.

To add to their woes, the team of the Medical Council of India will soon visit the college for inspection to see whether it qualifies for admitting the next batch of MBBS students or not.

Apart from the financial constraints that have been keeping the authorities on tenterhooks, the college has serious shortage of faculty, which might become a threat for the very existence of the institution. There are only about 75 faculty members against the requirement of about 150

for the medical college and some departments have only one or two doctors.

This is not the first time that the authorities have failed to disburse the salaries of staff for months together. There have been protests in the past too in this regard and the staff has

been completely boycotting working. This time also, the faculty has been repeatedly requesting the management to pay their salaries and had even brought the matter to the notice of Vice-Chancellor of the Baba Banda University of Health Sciences and Director Research and Med-

ical Education Dr. Sujata Sharma, but to no avail. Angered over the situation, the students have now joined the agitation, demanding timely salaries to their teachers and technical staff. Apart from that, the students are also demanding adequate staff strength, hostel facilities

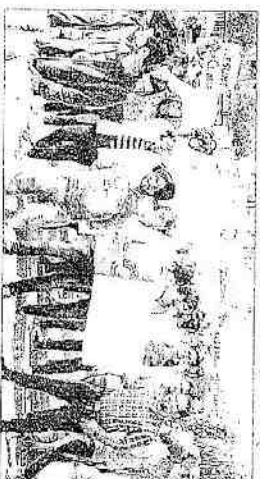

and proper utilisation of their fee. To get their demands fulfilled, the students also held a protest march holding banners and raised slogans against the management for present crisis. They have even met DRO, seeking intervention to save their future.

A student said though the exams were around the corner, the teaching had been suspended, putting our studies at risk. Moreover, hostellers were facing tough time as they had not been provided food by mess operators and electricity supply was erratic due to non-payment of electricity bill by the management, the student said.

Though we have time and again requested the management to look into our problems, all requests fall on deaf ears, and we are left with no option but to raise our voice against the management. Even now if the management does not take note of our issues, we will intensify our struggle, he said.

Meanwhile, accepting that the institution and the students were suffering as the university exams were near, Dr. AS. Sethon, Dean of the Gian Sagar Group of Institutions, said the management had assured him that they would try to resolve the issue in the coming week.

- 2) As a result of huge deficit of clinical patients we are even unable to complete our thesis work.
- 3) PG students have not been given monthly stipend for past 7 months.
- 4) Clinical training of PG students has also been severely hampered by strike which occurred last year. Even after strike was over, there was no improvement as far as clinical training of PG students was concerned.
- 5) Due to above stated factors our clinical training has been hampered due to which we are unable to acquire necessary clinical skills expected of a clinical PG students.
- 6) Electricity supply is only available in hostels for only 8 hours a day.
- 7) There are only "8 PG STUDENTS" in this institute in Dept. of Anaesthesia + Surgery (4 each).

This is to bring to your kind notice that we took admission on merit basis through BFUHS, Faridkot in Department of Anaesthesia & General Surgery in Gian Sagar Medical College & Hospital. The present scenario in the college due to ongoing strike since 1 month as a result of non-payment of salaries to the entire clinical & non-clinical faculty & hospital staff has adversely affected the clinical training & teaching of PG students (Anaesthesia & General Surgery). Last year also there was a similar situation which saw a complete shutdown of the institute. The management time & again ensured us that the condition of the institute would improve. But after the strike was over last year, there was no improvement.

For the last 1 year, there have not been enough patients for us to learn clinical & practical skills expected of a clinical PG student. Even for the thesis work the patient load is not ample. Moreover we have not been paid our monthly stipend for the past 7 months. We are the ones who are suffering the most. After observing the condition of the institute for past year & waiting for it to improve would be akin to experimenting with our career.

It is our humble request to you to shift the PG students of Anaesthesia & General Surgery to the other Medical Colleges of Punjab affiliated under BFUHS in order to continue our clinical training & teaching uninterrupted so that our crucial period of PG training does not go wasted.
